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


Farmer/Rancher Grant

These grants are for farmers to explore innovative sustainable agriculture solutions to production, marketing, labor, and more. Sustainable agriculture practices are tested through on-farm research, education, or demonstration projects and results are shared with other farmers.








Guidelines

- On-farm research, demonstration and/or educational projects
- Funding for 23 months
- 2021 \$720,000 total funds available
 - Individual \$9,000
 - Team 2 farms; \$18,000
 - Group 3 or more farms; \$27,000





Farmer – someone who raises crops or livestock, especially as a business.

- Team and Group Grant farmer participants must be separate farms.
- Team and Group Grant must designate a project coordinator.









- Clearly define problem
- Involve cooperators
- Measure project outcomes
- Emphasize outreach
- Demonstrate a good fit with SARE's mission









- Project proposal
- Budget with item descriptions and justification
- Letter of support
- Confirmation of commitment (Team and Group only)







Proposal Evaluation

- Project leader or team (10%)
- Project design (30%)
- Contribution to the growth of sustainable agriculture (15%)
- Outreach (20%)
- Evaluation (15%)
- Appropriate budget (10%)







Budget (allowed)

- Personnel
- Materials and supplies needed for the project (seed, fertilizer, portable fencing or other farming inputs, etc.)
- Travel (\$0.575/mile)
- Other direct costs (consultants, communications, conferences/meetings/workshops, speaker/trainer fees, copies, supplies)
- Equipment/permanent fencing, perennial seeds and plants (up to 50% of the cost of these items with justification)







Budget (not allowed)

- Not for everyday farming expenses
- Starting or expanding a farm or farm operation
- Equipment costing more than \$5,000
- Capital expenses (land, general farm improvements, construction of buildings, greenhouses, etc.)
- Permanent improvement to a farm, such as constructing or remodeling a building, permanent fencing, etc.
- Any meal that does not maintain the continuity of a meeting
- Testing of specific commercial products







2021 Grant Cycle

December 3, 2020 – Proposal due

Spring 2021 – Approximate date of start of grant between

April 1 and May 1 (50% of funds available)

January 31, 2022 – Progress report due (35% funds

available)

January 31, 2023 – Project end and final report due (15% funds, final payment)
